

TAX CUTS

684,000 Nebraskans benefited from the Making Work Pay tax cut, putting a total of \$346 million into Nebraskans' pockets in 2009 and \$327 million in 2010^{1,2}. The Making Work Pay tax cut put over **\$699,000** back into the economy of Chase County in 2009 and **\$660,000** in 2010³.

EDUCATION

Chase County's school districts were saved from making further cuts to their budgets through the use of over **\$431,000** in Recovery Act funds, including over⁴:

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

Over **\$119,000** in community improvement projects were also funded through the Recovery Act in Chase County, including over⁶:

- \$30,000 - Imperial Housing Authority - gutter replacement & new parking lot
- \$89,000 - Chase County - Rural transit improvements

LOAN ASSISTANCE

Over **\$6,303,000** in loans were awarded to individuals in Chase County, including⁷:


- \$462,000 - Farm Services Agency Farm Operating Direct Loans
- \$141,000 - Rural Development Single Family Housing Guaranteed Loans
- \$5,700,000 - Rural Development Business & Industry Guaranteed Loans

FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER CREDIT

More than 22,000 Nebraskans benefited from the First Time Homebuyer tax credit, returning more than **\$155.8 million** to the Nebraska economy from 2008 to 2010⁸.
