

TAX CUTS

684,000 Nebraskans benefited from the Making Work Pay tax cut, putting a total of \$346 million into Nebraskans' pockets in 2009 and \$327 million in 2010^{1,2}. The Making Work Pay tax cut put over **\$1,876,000** back into the economy of Cheyenne County in 2009 and **\$1,772,000** in 2010³.

EDUCATION

Cheyenne County schools received over **\$1,970,000** from the Recovery Act, preventing the school districts from making additional cuts to their budgets, including over⁴:

Leyton Public Schools	\$186,000
Potter-Dix Public Schools	\$171,000
Sidney Public Schools	\$1,613,000



COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

Over **\$3,405,000** in community improvement projects have been funded through the Recovery Act in Cheyenne County, including over⁵:

- \$283,000 - Village of Dalton - drinking water facilities
- \$2,750,000 - City of Sidney - waste water treatment facilities
- \$89,000 - City of Sidney - New transit vehicles, bus house facility, salary funding and computers⁶
- \$283,000 - Village of Dalton - Drinking water revolving loan fund⁷

LOAN ASSISTANCE

Over **\$907,000** was awarded to individuals in Cheyenne County, including⁸:

- \$907,000 - Rural Development Single Family Housing Direct Loans & Guaranteed Loans

FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER CREDIT


More than 22,000 Nebraskans benefited from the First Time Homebuyer tax credit, returning more than **\$155.8 million** to the Nebraska economy from 2008 to 2010⁹.



ROADS

The Nebraska Department of Roads was awarded over **\$1,380,000** for pavement improvement on I-80 between Sidney and Chappell¹⁰.
