

TAX CUTS

684,000 Nebraskans benefitted from the Making Work Pay tax cut, putting a total of \$346 million into Nebraskans' pockets in 2009 and \$327 million in 2010^{1,2}. The Making Work Pay tax cut put more than **\$1,213,000** into the pockets of Dixon County residents in 2009 and **\$1,146,000** in 2010³.

EDUCATION

Dixon County's school districts were saved from making further cuts to their budgets through the use of over **\$1,873,000** in Recovery Act funds, including over⁴:

Allen Consolidated Schools	\$273,000
Emerson-Hubbard Public Schools*	\$285,000
Newcastle Public Schools	\$166,000
Ponca Public Schools	\$517,000
Wakefield Public Schools*	\$613,000
Educational Service Unit #1*	\$19,000



COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

Community improvement projects have been funded through the Recovery Act, including **\$31,000** to the Emerson Housing Authority to replace windows in public housing units⁵.

LOAN ASSISTANCE

Over **\$1,262,000** in loans were awarded to individuals in Dixon County, including⁶:

- \$448,000 - Farm Service Agency Farm Operating Direct Loans
- \$814,000 - Rural Development Single Family Housing Direct Loans & Guaranteed Loans

FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER CREDIT

More than 22,000 Nebraskans benefitted from the First Time Homebuyer tax credit, returning more than **\$155.8 million** to the Nebraska economy from 2008 to 2010⁷.




Roads

Many road projects were made possible through the Recovery Act. Dixon County was given over **\$372,000** to replace a bridge southwest of Concord⁸.
