

TAX CUTS

684,000 Nebraskans benefitted from the Making Work Pay tax cut, putting a total of \$346 million into Nebraskans' pockets in 2009 and \$327 million in 2010^{1,2}. The Making Work Pay tax cut put more than **\$596,000** back into the economy of Franklin County in 2009 and **\$563,000** in 2010³.

EDUCATION

Franklin County's public schools received over **\$733,000** in Recovery Act funds, preventing the schools from making additional cuts to their budgets⁴:

Franklin Public Schools	\$483,000
Wilcox-Hildreth Public Schools*	\$77,000
Educational Service Unit #11*	\$173,000

LOAN ASSISTANCE

Over **\$105,000** in Rural Development Single Family Housing Guaranteed Loans were awarded to individuals in Franklin County⁵.

FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER CREDIT

More than 22,000 Nebraskans benefited from the First Time Homebuyer tax credit, returning more than **\$155.8 million** to the Nebraska economy from 2008 to 2010⁶.




ROADS
