

## TAX CUTS

684,000 Nebraskans benefitted from the Making Work Pay tax cut, putting a total of \$346 million into Nebraskans' pockets in 2009 and \$327 million in 2010<sup>1,2</sup>. The Making Work Pay tax cut put more than **\$485,000** back into the economy of Frontier County in 2009 and **\$458,000** in 2010<sup>3</sup>.

## EDUCATION

Frontier County schools received over **\$638,000** from the Recovery Act, preventing the school districts from making additional cuts to their budgets, including over<sup>4</sup>:



Eustis-Farnam Public Schools	\$162,000
Maywood Public Schools	\$112,000
Medicine Valley Public Schools	\$351,000
Educational Service Unit #15*	\$13,000

## COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

Community improvement projects have been funded through the Recovery Act<sup>5</sup>.

- **\$39,000** - Curtis Housing Authority - new units



## LOAN ASSISTANCE

Over **\$119,000** in loans were awarded to individuals in Frontier County, including<sup>6</sup>:

- \$26,000 - Farm Service Agency Farm Operating Direct Loans
- \$93,000 - Rural Development Single Family Housing Guaranteed Loans

## FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER CREDIT


More than 22,000 Nebraskans benefited from the First Time Homebuyer tax credit, returning more than **\$155.8 million** to the Nebraska economy from 2008 to 2010<sup>7</sup>.



## ROADS

Over **\$932,000** was provided by the Recovery Act to resurface a county road east of Stockville<sup>8</sup>.
