

## Division of Funding in Greeley County

### TAX CUTS

684,000 Nebraskans benefitted from the Making Work Pay tax cut, putting a total of \$346 million into Nebraskans' pockets in 2009 and \$327 million in 2010<sup>1,2</sup>. The Making Work Pay tax cut put more than **\$434,000** back into the economy of Greeley County in 2009 and **\$410,000** in 2010<sup>3</sup>.

### EDUCATION

Greeley County's school districts were saved from making further cuts to their budgets through the use of over **\$978,000** in Recovery Act funds, including over<sup>4</sup>:

Greeley-Wolbach Public Schools	\$210,000
North Loup Scotia Public Schools	\$315,000
Spalding Public Schools	\$190,000
Educational Service Unit #10*	\$263,000

### COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

Over **\$5,000** was provided to the Catholic Diocese of Omaha to purchase equipment to make school lunches<sup>5</sup>.

### LOAN ASSISTANCE

Over **\$430,000** in Farm Service Agency Farm Operating Direct Loans were awarded to individuals in Greeley County<sup>6</sup>.




### FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER CREDIT

More than 22,000 Nebraskans benefitted from the First Time Homebuyer tax credit, returning more than **\$155.8 million** to the Nebraska economy from 2008 to 2010<sup>7</sup>.
