

## Division of Funding in Stanton County

### TAX CUTS

684,000 Nebraskans benefitted from the Making Work Pay tax cut, putting a total of \$346 million into Nebraskans' pockets in 2009 and \$327 million in 2010<sup>1,2</sup>. The Making Work Pay tax cut put over **\$1,218,000** back into the economy of Stanton County in 2009 and **\$1,150,000** in 2010<sup>3</sup>.

### EDUCATION

Stanton County school received over **\$565,000** from the Recovery Act, preventing the school district from making additional cuts to its budget, including over<sup>4</sup>:

Stanton Community Schools	\$549,000
Educational Service Unit #8*	\$16,000

### COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

Over **\$1,193,000** in community improvement projects were also funded through the Recovery Act. This includes<sup>5</sup>:

#### Housing

- \$47,000 - Stanton Housing Authority - energy efficient HVAC

#### Energy Efficiency

- \$749,000 - Stanton County Public Power District - Smart Grid Investment
- \$397,000 - Stanton County Public Power District - Advanced Metering Systems



### LOAN ASSISTANCE

Over **\$648,000** in loans were awarded to individuals in Stanton County, including<sup>6</sup>:

- \$19,000 - Farm Service Agency Farm Operating Direct Loans
- \$629,000 - Rural Development Single Family Housing Direct & Guaranteed Loans




### FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER CREDIT

More than 22,000 Nebraskans benefitted from the First Time Homebuyer tax credit, returning more than **\$155.8 million** to the Nebraska economy from 2008 to 2010<sup>7</sup>.
