

TAX CUTS

684,000 Nebraskans are benefitting from the Making Work Pay tax cut, putting a total of \$346 million into Nebraskans' pockets in 2009 and \$327 million in 2010^{1,2}. For Wayne County, that meant a savings of over **\$1,785,000** in taxes in 2009 and **\$1,686,000** in 2010³.

EDUCATION

Wayne County's school districts were saved from making further cuts to their budgets through the use of over **\$1,552,000** in Recovery Act funds, including over⁴:

Wakefield Public Schools*	\$613,000
Wayne Community Schools	\$692,000
Winside Public Schools	\$228,000
Educational Service Unit #1*	\$19,000

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

Over **\$280,000** in community improvement projects were also funded through the Recovery Act, including over⁵:

★ Housing

- \$50,000 - Wayne Housing Authority, Inc. - improve energy efficiency

★ Energy Efficiency

- \$41,000 - Rose's Transport Inc. - reduce diesel emissions
- \$189,000 - City of Wayne - Nebraska Clean Water State Revolving Loan Fund

LOAN ASSISTANCE


Over **\$4,675,000** in loans were awarded to individuals in Wayne County, including⁶:

- \$532,000 - Farm Service Agency Farm Operating Direct Loans
- \$643,000 - Rural Development Single Family Housing Direct Loans & Guaranteed Loans
- \$3,500,000 - Rural Development Community Facilities Loans

FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER CREDIT

More than 22,000 Nebraskans benefited from the First Time Homebuyer tax credit, returning more than **\$155.8 million** to the Nebraska economy from 2008 to 2010⁷.
